

## Overview of Development and Testing of Pre-briefing Elements

A team of four members of the 2018 cohort of the Leadership Development Program for Simulation Educators with an interest in pre-briefing have created a checklist to guide the pre-briefing process to meet the project requirement for the Leadership Development Program. They began with a search of the literature and found that while published literature offered a variety of information related to recommended elements that should be included in pre-briefing, no validated checklists or standardized tools existed.

The team generated a list of 25 statements derived from the INACSL Standards of Best Practice: Simulation<sup>SM</sup> (2016) document and peer-reviewed articles. Five simulation experts reviewed the statements. An established acceptable value for item inclusion in the pre-briefing checklist without revision is an I-CVI of .80 (Polit and Beck, 2008). All 25 items met this criterion. Twenty-two had an established I-CVI of 1.00 and the remaining three items had an I-CVI of .80. A scale-level CVI was also completed. The values of all 25 items were added and then an average was taken to get a S-CVI/Ave value of .976 which is considered sufficient to establish excellent content validity of the scale in its entirety.
